




Sul Ross - 1951










On Saturday, April the fourteenth mineteen hundred twenty-three from four to mix o'clock at the South Junior High School.








#### TENANTS MOVE INTO NEW HOMES 10-24-41 EARNEST DEARMAN NAMED MANAGER














Cotton Arch at 13th and Clay - 1914


